Minutes of the Meeting of St Teresa's Parish Council

Thursday 18th July 2019 8p.m.

- 1 The Meeting opened at 8p.m. with a Prayer
- 2 Apologies: Jim Murray, Trisha Barker, Ajith Antony, Fr Shyju
- 3 The Minutes of the last Meeting were approved and signed.

4 Finance Report and Gift Aid

At Tony Frall's request this item was taken next.

Tony Frall, representing the Finance Committee, brought copies of the Receipts and Payments Account year ending 31st March 2019 and circulated them to Members. Key points to note were:

- Collections appear to have stayed static for a number of years. Tony said that we need to ask people to use Gift Aid more.
- The Diocese asked us to donate £100,000.00 per year for three years to the Cathedral Centre. We are now in the final year of this commitment.
- The principal rents we receive are from John Lewis (Waitrose) and Bekonscot but this item also includes Parish Centre rents.
- There was a rise in Property Maintenance costs last year.
- There will be a Presentation by the Finance Committee to the Parish in September, and Members of the Committee will be available in the Narthex to take questions after each of the Masses at that time.

5. Matters Arising

5.1 Welcome and Communication

Trish F reported that all Parish Groups have been e-mailed their entries in the Welcome Pack and invited to edit/update the contents. The majority of people have responded.

When this completed, Annie will collate the results, update the Welcome Pack and out them on the Website.

There was a query re GDPR and personal data inclusion. Fr Sean had spoken with Brin Dunsire (Diocesan GDPR Representative) regarding this. When the above contents are put on the Website, the Parish Office should appear as the contact point.

John G asked about the mechanism for picking up new Parishioners. Susannah would be the contact point and then pass on details to enable visits.

5.2 Parish Fete

The Fete raised approx. £9,300.00 on the day, including the Raffle and Silent Auction, and further monies are still coming in so we should raise approximately £10,000.00.

John G. said that whilst he would still be happy to help with the Fete next year, he would not be in a position to take on the overall running of the Fete.

There was a lengthy discussion about the future of the Fete and other ways in which we could raise funds.

- A new team is needed to take over the running of the Fete for next year. Some young
 Parishioners were involved on some of the stalls and were very enthusiastic. Rebecca,
 Kate and Josephine had become involved this year too. It was agreed that we need to
 begin recruiting this new team now.
- Annie asked if we need to carry on with the Fete or is it time to do something different?
- Brent said that in South Africa they had faced a similar situation and had organised an Auction of Promises Evening, International Food Fair (the Church got a liquor licence for the day and half the money raised came from the sale of Irish Coffees!) and a Lottery.
- John G said that half the money we send to Mongu comes from the Fete.

Fr Sean raised the question of how much longer are we going to support Mongu? Maybe the amount we raise each year will change. This needs to be discussed with the Presentation Sisters saying that we may not be able to give as much money each year as before.

Trish F asked if we were going to transfer our fundraising from Mongu to other organisations such as CAFOD, referencing the recent Awareness Weekend and Hog Roast. She pointed out that there may be resistance from older Parishioners to reducing the amount of help given to Mongu.

A decision needs to be made by the end of the year as to what is to happen to the Fete.

Which raised the question of Volunteers to step up to the plate. John G pointed out that the SVP in our District are having similar problems filling vacancies caused by Officers retiring, as are many organisations.

5.3 CCTV

Fr Sean had had a quote from Top Notch (recommended by Diocese) for £13,000 plus VAT.

Various questions were raised regarding this amount. The Finance Committee had considered it expensive. Pat O'Brien pointed out that if we had requested a top of the range system then it would be expensive and perhaps something less expensive would be appropriate.

John G then referred to the Notes he had circulated prior to the meeting with some thoughts on how we might take things forward together with a list of Parish Groups.

He highlighted the main points of emphasis -

- need to detail clearly roles to be filled,
- recognition and affirmation of work done by volunteers,
- follow up on offers of help,
- making sure people don't stay in roles too long.

John G. concluded by saying he was happy to liaise on behalf of the Parish Council with the SVP and all things to do with Mongu.

Lively discussion followed.

Fr Sean is to put together a Census of the Parish.
